A Generous Ownership

INSTRUCT THEM TO DO GOOD, TO BE RICH IN GOOD WORKS, TO BE GENEROUS AND READY TO SHARE, STORING UP FOR THEMSELVES THE TREASURE OF A GOOD FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE, SO THAT THEY MAY TAKE HOLD OF THAT WHICH IS LIFE INDEED.

~ 1ST TIMOTHY 6: 18-19 (NASB)

1) The Constitution Of Discipleship

- A) In previous weeks, we have been studying basic characteristics for every follower of Jesus Christ. These characteristics represent the "marks of Christ's disciples:"
 - i) Mercy. Followers of Jesus have faith in Christ (content, trust, perseverance) by receiving the grace of God (free gift), through an ongoing relationship with Jesus.
 - ii) **Transformation.** Followers of Jesus show a submission and relationship to God through reading, studying, and personal transformation through His Word (the Bible).
 - iii) **Unity.** Followers of Jesus live in unity with one another, building His local and global church through groups and personal relationships.
 - iv) **Service.** Followers of Jesus are called to serve one another from grateful and responsive souls which recognize God's great gifts and serve one another in the knowledge we are actually serving Christ Himself.



- A) Whether it was Christ's restorative comments to Peter (John 21) or the many exhortations to live as disciples of Jesus in the Newer Testament (1st & 2nd Timothy), the overarching message is clear... **Own the message and the mission!**
- B) The miracle of God's gifts (mercy, transformation, unity, service, and generous ownership) are that they could all be accomplished perfectly without our involvement by God, **but He chooses us anyway** (1st Corinthians 1:25).
- C) In God's generous inclusion of us in the mission of His church, we are also called to **be generous** in our response to God's people and His church (1st Timothy 6:17-19).
- D) This kind of generosity **requires adjusting our lives to God's schedule, to God's economy, and to God's priorities.** Clearly, being "generous and ready to share"
 (6:18) means that we give of ourselves as though everything in the church depends on our own involvement, while recognizing everything in the church depends on God.
- E) God supplies the church with gifts and talents (through individuals and through groups) to be **generously shared** (1st Corinthians 12:14-31).
- F) God supplies everyone in the church with resources for investing in Christ's church, locally and around the world. Again, owning the ministry and investing in the vision of what God is doing (glocally) is a response of generosity which comes from a great heart, not from great wealth (2nd Corinthians 8:1-6). Don't just sit there! RESPOND!
