"MATHEMATIKS OF GRACE"

I) WHEREVER THERE IS DEATH, YOU ARE SEEING THE PENALTY OF SIN

- A. By going back to the beginning of human history, to the time of Adam & Eve and the beginning of the plague of sin among all people, the Apostle Paul has to address whether or not sin was counted against a person in the absence of a rule or Law (Romans 5:12-14).
- B. On the one hand, Adam was given a very specific "law" from God which allowed him to eat of any tree in the Garden of Eden, but prohibited him from eating the fruit from the one "tree of the knowledge of good and evil" (Genesis 2:16-17). However, from that time until the Law of Moses, was anyone actually guilty of violating God's rules or laws?
- C. The answer, of course, is a resounding "YES!" Why do we know that mankind was guilty? Because they died, and death is the penalty for sin. Even in the absence of an explicit code of laws, and even though people did not sin in the same manner as Adam himself (cf. Romans 5:14), men died because they were, in fact, guilty of sin against the Creator.

II) THE MATHEMATICS OF SIN AND GRACE

- A. Sin infected the entire human race through Adam's sin. For Paul, this is "proved" by the universal condition of death (a result of sin) which mankind clearly suffers (Romans 5:12). The primary focus (here) is on the result of Adam's sin, and not the source of sin for each person.
- B. However, Paul is also concerned to note Adam is a "type" of Christ (historical characters or institutions which foreshadowed Christ and the initiation of God's ultimate reign over all things, 5:14). While Paul is primarily viewing death as a natural result of personal sin, he is also viewing all mankind as Adam's offspring resulting in mankind's universal "sin nature" (note 5:19). Both truths are in view, all mankind is corporately sinful (by nature, as Adam's offspring), and all mankind is individually sinful (deliberately sinful, individually).



- C. Like the "federal" vote of our local U.S.. Representative in the House of Representatives, their 'one vote' represents all of our local constituency. Likewise, the penalty for sin is death (Romans 5:15, see also 6:23), and death "federally" extends to all men through Adam's sin. Adam's sin seems small, but its impact infects all of mankind like a plague!
- D. Unlike Adam's one sin, God's free gift of Jesus Christ is not small. Rather, the gift of grace in Jesus covers a multitude of sins, the sins you can remember and the sins you cannot remember (or don't even know about)! Adam's sin started small, but the sacrifice of Jesus was never small! It has always been greater in every possible way than sin (5:15-17).
- E. While death began its reign because of the sin of Adam and multiplied to all men, grace and justification by faith (the declaration of righteousness from God) suddenly and dramatically reigned in abundance through Jesus Christ **MUCH MORE**! This is the "good math" of Heaven! Faith in the death-defying life of Jesus Christ is sufficient for all men to be forgiven, declared righteous, and defy death for life eternal (Romans 5:18)!
- F. The question for us all is "which man will we identify with for eternity?" Will our identity be with Adam, the "head" of the human race? Or will our identity be "in Christ," our Creator and the rightful ruler of Heaven? One Adam sinned, and death multiplied. The 'Second Adam' died sinless, and conquered death once and for all (Romans 5:19).
- G. This is the final equation of the mathematics of grace! The provision of grace is infinite! There is no way to "out-sin" the grace of God in Jesus Christ (Romans 5:20-21)! Grace always wins, because the sacrifice of Jesus Christ brings life which can no longer suffer from the effects of death! Where there is no sin, there is no death. By God's grace, this is the life provided in Jesus Christ, justification by faith forevermore!
