Giving Away Your Crunchy Apple

DO NOTHING FROM SELFISHNESS OR EMPTY CONCEIT, BUT WITH HUMILITY OF MIND REGARD ONE ANOTHER AS MORE IMPORTANT THAN YOURSELVES; DO NOT MERELY LOOK OUT FOR YOUR OWN PERSONAL INTERESTS, BUT ALSO FOR THE INTERESTS OF OTHERS. ~PHILIPPIANS 2:3-4 (NASB)

1) Focus #1: Christ-Centered Relationships

- A) God's plan from the beginning (Genesis 2:24) is supporting, building and encouraging relationships which are Christ centered -- especially the family (Psalm 78:5-8).
- B) The Christ-centered family is an example to the world of Jesus Christ (Ephesians 5:31-32). In other words, the world sees Jesus in our (family) relationships!
- C) God has not abandoned us! Rather, God reveals Himself to us (e.g. Song of Songs, 1st & 2nd Corinthians, Ephesians) through Christ-centered relationships. Begin with Jesus!

2) Relationship Focus #2: Patience For God's Best

- A) Rather than seek completion in others (What are you looking for in...?), the Bible calls on Christ-centered people to be focused on Christ first, and their own relationship with Him (1st Thessalonians 4:1-12).
- B) For those who are seeking a relationship (and wondering what God is up to...) -- **BE PATIENT!** For those who are dating, courting, or engaged (and are tempted to rush...) -- **BE PATIENT!** For those who are married (and are wanting for more...) -- **BE PATIENT!**
- C) Spend your best time becoming the person God wants **YOU** to be! Worrying about others and what they are becoming is a waste of your time! BE PATIENT as God changes you into the person He has designed (2nd Corinthians 12:9-10).

3) Relationship Focus #3: Purity In God's Eyes

A) Purity should distinguish all Christ-centered relationships (1st Thessalonians 4:7-8). However, the call to purity is "nuanced" for men and women in the Bible.

i. Men are called to "inward purity" in the Bible. For instance, Job's "covenant with his eyes" (Job 31:1). Men are not to "look" on women with lust (Matthew 5:28).

- ii. Why? Because Christian women are united with Christ **FIRST** (1st Corinthians 6:17-20). Lust (idolatry of a woman in front of God) is a clear violation of God's plan!
- iii. Men, <u>FLEE IMMORALITY</u> in your attraction and observation of women! To do so is active worship of God, and shows you are God's man (1st Corinthians 6:18)!

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i. Women are called to "outward purity" in the Bible. For instance, women are called to dress modestly (1st Timothy 2:9-10). Women are called to be careful in their communication (1st Timothy 3:11, 4:7, & Titus 2:3).

- ii. Why? Because Christian men are united with Christ **FIRST** (1st Corinthians 6:17-20). Visual appearance is like wine in the Song of Solomon! While men are at least 51% responsible for what they "drink" (observe), women are at least 49% responsible for what they offer as a drink (appearance). Christian women don't let Christian men "drink" too much! Protect our men!
- iii. Women, **SHOW RESTRAINT** in how you dress! To do so is active worship of God, and shows you are God's woman (1st Corinthians 6:18)!
- B) The Christian who refuses to flee immorality and show restraint in their relationships is destined for destruction -- **DO NOT EVEN ASSOCIATE WITH THEM** (1st Corinthians 5:11, 2nd Timothy 3).

4) Relationship Focus #4: Embracing Servanthood

- A) Humility and service are biblical (John 13:5-16, Proverbs 16:18, 1st Peter 5:5), but not popular in any culture.
- B) When a couple is dating, courting, or engaged -- serving the other person comes quite easily! However, over time the simple call of Philippians 2:3-4 can get lost.
- C) God's Word says that the way you treat others is actually how you are treating God (Matthew 25:31-46) -- especially in the marriage relationship (Ephesians 5:15-33). What "crunchy apple" will you give to express your love (to Jesus)?
