Revelation 20:7-15 Notes

The Last Battle (20:7-10)

- A. The millennium is addressed very briefly, coming to a close as Satan is paroled/released from prison (20:2, 7).
- B. Satan, as is his nature, leads rebellion against God by deceiving the nations (20:8, Gog & Magog, cf. Ezekiel 38-39), gathering a massive army against God's people (20:9).
- C. The battle is quick, almost instantaneous, as God conquers with fire and captures Satan again, condemning Him eternally to the Lake of Fire (20:10).

The Great White Throne Judgment (20:11-15)

A. Satan's judgment & fall triggers the heavenly (20:11) judgment of God, symbolizing God's justice and righteousness with a Great White Throne. (20:11).

B. As the "books" are opened (Book of Deeds, Book of Life), the final judgment begins (20:12-13). The judgment is described (note the genre!) in Matthew 25:31-46 (cf. 1 Peter 4:17), in the "Sheep & Goats Parable."

C. The entire demonic realm are judged. Death, Hades, and sin (AMAZING!) are thrown in the Lake of Fire for eternal torment (20:13-14, cf. 20:10).

D. Sadly, in addition, all those who have not been transformed by Christ (not believed) will also go into the Lake of Fire (20:15).
