The earth produces by itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. ~Mark 4:28 (ESV)

1) Slinging Seed

- A) The Parable of the Secretly Growing Seed is found only in Mark 4:26-29, and is followed by the better known Parable of the Mustard Seed (4:30-32), which also has parallels in Matthew 13:31-32 & Luke 13:18.
- B) In Mark's Gospel (probably the first-written Gospel account, based on Peter's perspectives), Chapter 4 is the "seed chapter," containing the important (and context setting) Parable of the Soils (Mark 4:3-20).
- C) The most significant context for the parables we will consider today is found Mark 4:14, "the sower sows the word." By our Christ-unified identity, we constantly sling the seed of God's Word, it's who we are!

2) Seed Grows

- A) Scattering seed is an intentional action (Mark 4:26), which considers environment (cf. 4:3-20). While we scatter seed by our nature, we also cultivate good environments for growth, "aiming" for fertile soil.
- B) But, "life goes on" (4:27), and while we do not often see seed develop, God has designed the "soils" of earth for growth (4:28). The seed of God's Word grows. It's what seed does -- seed grows. As God's "Gospel Farmers," this should fill us with great confidence!

3) Explosively Expansive Harvest

A) God is at work! He is bringing the harvest because it is the natural effect of His Word. Expect a harvest from the fertile soil in which God's Word is planted (4:29). The harvest is explosive (4:31), producing a great return on investment (4:32). From small beginnings comes unexpected growth and expansion, beyond the expectation of its beginnings!
