# Walk This Way!

#### 1) We have been made new in Christ!

- A) Paul explains our new identity in Christ by referring to the theological foundation he developed throughout the first half of the book of Ephesians. He points back to these three chapters with the word "therefore" (4:1).
- B) God called Ephesian believers to Him. He saved them (1:13-18)!
- C) Paul readers' had a new calling that would change how they would "walk" (2:1-2, 10).
- D) Paul described how the Ephesians were called into a new, unified group (2:15,18).

# 2) We should live in a way that flows out of our identity as people made new in Christ.

A) Paul continues the metaphor of walking, this time encouraging his readers to "walk in a manner worthy of the calling" they have received (4:1).

- B) As a "prisoner for the Lord," Paul proved he had "walked worthily" (3:1,13, 4:1). This gave him credibility to invite his readers to join him in living out their identity in Christ.
- C) Paul explains how we live out our identity in Christ through many different examples in Ephesians 4-6.

# 3) One of the ways we live out our new identity in Christ is by maintaining unity with each other.

- A) Paul highlights different characteristics that will help believers to stay unified with each other (4:2-3). Christians should walk...
  1. Humbly
  - 2. Gently
  - 3. Patiently
  - 4. In love, bearing with one another
- B) Each of these characteristics contribute to maintaining unity with each other (Ephesians 4:3). Christians have already been unified (2:13-18), but still need to work at staying unified with one another (John 13:34-35). Living in peace makes this possible (Ephesians 4:3).
- C) In Christ, we've been made new, so live that out with those around you! Remember who you are and live that way!
