1. What kind of satisfaction is found in Christ? Matthew 5:6
2. Who will be children of God? Matthew 5:9
3. What is the response of believers to be when they are slandered or treated unfairly because of Jesus? Matthew 5:12
4. Believers are not to live for themselves, but for whom? 2 Corinthians 5:15
5. We regard no one according to the flesh, or in a purely physical way (2 Corinthians 5:16). What do you think this means?
6. Write down 2 Corinthians 5:17.
7. All this is from God, who through Christ _____ us to Himself and gave us the ministry of _____; that is, in Christ God was _____ the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of _____.
