

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Isaiah 9:6-7

1) *Mary's Soul Desire*

- A) Mary's quick and obedient response to the Angel Gabriel moved her to visit her relative Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-45). When the two first-time mothers encounter one another, the Holy Spirit indwells Elizabeth, moving her to speak a blessing over Mary.
- B) Mary's response to Elizabeth's blessing is commonly called "Mary's Magnificat." The word "Magnificat" is derived from the first word of the Latin translation of Luke 1:46-55. Latin was the official formal language of the Roman Catholic church and was used for centuries in Catholic readings and services.
- C) Simply, 'Magnificat' means "magnify," and is the first response of Mary's soul to Elizabeth's blessing. Oddly, the Catholic church has chosen to magnify Mary through many of these verses (some of you might have recognized smatterings of "Hail Mary" from 1:28 & 42), but this is a distracting and dangerous error.
- D) Ironically, the focus of Mary's response is not on herself! Rather, Mary reveals a current and continuing "soul desire" for a life of magnifying the Lord (1:46). Like an object seen through a magnifying glass, Mary's focus is on God, not herself!

2) *Mary's Amazing Response Of Praise*

- A) Mary's joy is in magnifying the Lord (1:47) by contrasting her own "humble estate" (humiliation, resignation) as a "servant" (slave) and her undeserved blessing (joy, happiness) which will be for "all generations" (echoing Elizabeth's blessing, 1:45) against the mighty power and holiness of God (1:48-49).
- B) Mary uses her life of simplicity and humble reverence (fear of the Lord) to highlight (magnify) God's mercy for "generation to generation" (hearkening back to Gabriel's promises, 1:32-33). Mary is essentially using herself as an example of all of God's people who were empty, broken, and weak. If God will use Mary, she reasons, God must truly be holy & powerful (1:50).
- C) Mary lives in a country controlled by a demonic puppet King (Herod the "Great"), who is actually controlled by the far away super-power of Rome, controlled by Julius Caesar's adopted son, Octavian, also known as Caesar Augustus. The Jews hated the occupation of these foreigners, and longed for their freedom, to be provided by the Messiah (cf. Isaiah 7 & 9).
- D) Mary's blessing, she understands, is not just for herself, but for all generations. She understands the plight of Israel, the horror of their abuse under Rome, and the frustration of corrupt rulers. She rightfully recognizes she is carrying the Promised Immanuel (Isaiah 7:14), who will judge the "proud" and topple the "mighty," for those of "humble estate" (1:51-52, cf. 1:48).
- E) Mary brings a "theology of reversals" full-circle, now contrasting those that have been hungry, as those who will be filled by the Messiah. Those who have been rich (self-sufficient, satisfied with this world) will be judged on their investment, and sent away with nothing; bankrupted by the intoxication of their own idols of pride and power (1:51-53).
- F) Finally, Mary recognizes God's great mercy for Israel. God has not forgotten His people of promise (1:54-55). Mary's simplicity and humility serve to magnify God's greatness and mercy!
