- The godly parents, faithful to the Law, 2:22-24, 39-40
- The godly prophetess, devoted to the Lord, 2:36-38

1) The Child is salvation for all peopl (Luke 2:29-32; 3:6)

- A) He is the light of revelation to the Gentiles, Luke 2:31-32a; Isaiah 42:6; 49:6; Acts 13:47; Luke 3:6; 24:47; Acts 1:8; 26:16-28, 23; 28:28.
- B) He is the glory of God's people Israel, Luke 2:32b; Isa 60:1-22, especially 60:1-2, 19-20.C

2) The Child is a sign to be rejected (Luke 2:34-35)

- A) He can cause your rise or fall, Luke 2:34b; Isaiah 8:13 -15; 28:16; Psalm 118:22; Romans 9:32-33; 1 Peter 2:6-8; Luke 20:7-18.
- B) He meets with rejection, Luke 2:34c-35a; Luke Chapters 4-21, 22-23; Acts Chapters 4-28.
- C) He reveals your true thoughts, Luke 2:35b; 5:21-22; 6:8; 8:17; 1 Corinthians 4:5.

3) The Child is a Savior for you to believe in, despite all obstacles

- Know the "certainty" of those things you have been taught about Jesus, Luke 1:4
- A) In spite of delay, Luke 1:5-25 and 2:25-35
- B) In spite of circumstances, Luke 1:26-56
- C) In spite of how God does amazing things through humble people and things, Luke 2:8-20
- D) In spite of Jesus' crucifixion, Luke Chapters 22-23
- E) In spite of Jesus' rejection by most Jewish people, Acts Chapters 4-13 and 28
- F) In spite of Jesus' rejection by most Gentile people, Acts Chapters 14-19
- G) In spite of the persecution and suffering that God's people endure, Acts Chapters 4-28

In-Depth

Read Luke 2:22-40

Discuss what you learned from this week's sermon.

- 1. Verse 22-24: There are two different acts going on at the temple, one for Jesus and one for Mary.
 - A. Read Exodus 13:11-15, Numbers 3:12-13 and Numbers 18:15-16. Why was Jesus presented at the temple? In what way did he need to be redeemed?
 - B. Read Leviticus 12:1-8. Why was Mary at the temple? What did her offering tell us about Joseph and Mary?

3. This is the first of Satan's attempts to destroy God's plan for his Messiah. What are some others, and how did they turn out?

Making It Relevant

- 1. Despite Satan's attempts, the will of God cannot be thwarted. So like Simeon (and Mary and Zechariah) we can have confidence in His word. Which promises of God provide you with comfort?
- 2. Over to past weeks we've studied 5 hymns of praise to God (angels, Elizabeth, Mary, Zechariah, Simeon). What did they teach you about praise?

The universal offer of the message of Jesus to all peoples

Christianity as non-subversive, not a threat to Jewish people or the Roman Empire; a tendency to defend Christianity from criticism

God's purpose achieved in spite of intense opposition

The religion of the Jewish people as the cradle of Christianity

Miracles as the sign that the Age of Messiah is come

Salvation, coming from God through Jesus Christ

The Kingdom of God: begun, but not fully realized

The Church remaining in the world as Jesus' Second Coming is delayed (present in Acts, but not as prominent as in Luke)

The Purpose of Luke's Gospel

To STRENGTHEN FAITH in the LORD Jesus as the One through whom God has provided SALVATION for ALL PEOPLE, as proven by Jesus' WORDS and WORKS.

See also Elizabeth in 1:45: "...and blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what had been spoken to her by the Lord."
