In Remembrance Of Me

One of the dangers we face when reading about spiritual warfare is thinking it's all a bit too fanciful... that it's something that happened a long time ago, during a simpler time, before people understood how things really worked. We have the answers of advanced science and technology to many of life's great mysteries. Perhaps, if given enough time, we will no doubt unravel all the mysteries of the universe?

Many of us who are Jesus' followers have unfortunately limited our faith in Christ to the boundaries which science and what can be proven to be real allow! But then...

Jesus takes bread and wine and tells His disciples that reality is entirely different than they might think. He tells them they are not just eating bread and drinking winel In reality they are eating His body and drinking His blood!

Reality is that this is a different Passover meal altogether! Jesus says,

For one who has died has been set free from sin.

"I tell you the truth, he who believes has everlasting life. I am the bread of life... But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which a man may eat and not die... For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink (John 6:47-50, 55).

Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. Matthew 5:19

1) Jesus Reaches Rockstar Status

- A) Let's take a quick moment to remember the remarkable road Jesus has walked in just a few shorts months. His Father pronounces His pure pleasure and pride in His Son, Jesus; who is equipped and filled by the Spirit of God for the beginning of His ministry life (Luke 3:21-22).
- B) Almost immediately, Jesus goes from this incredible high point of His Father's public affirmation to the desolation of desert temptations suffered under the brutal influence of Satan, a kind of 'final exam' before the ministry of Jesus Christ goes public (4:1-13).
- C) Of course, after forty days of fasting and temptation in the desert, Jesus goes home to recuperate and begins teaching in his hometown of Nazareth (4:13-27). Shockingly, Jesus is rejected and run out of Nazareth, miraculously escaping a mob intending to harm Him (4:28-30).
- D) Jesus departs the disappointment of hometown Nazareth for the delight of ministry in Capernaum. Jesus connects with common folks who receive His teaching and find tremendous freedom from physical and demonic bondage through His powerful and authoritative ministry (4:31-39).
- E) News about Jesus rockets from Capernaum all around Galilee as crowds press in on Jesus. Jesus tirelessly heals the sick. He casts out demons with suffocating authority. He loves the broken, healing "every one of them," laying His hands on them with tenderness (4:40-41).
- F) Capernaum warmly receives the teaching and ministry of Jesus Christ! This is the moment all of history has been anticipating, the arrival of Messiah and the tender ministry of the Great Shepherd (cf. Micah 5:4).
- G) Jesus is suddenly a rockstar, the kid from Nazareth has made the bigtime in Capernaum. Once again local townspeople pursue Jesus, but this time they want to keep Him for themselves (4:42). What a great moment in history! The King has come, He is rescuing, people are experiencing freedom, Satan's power is falling, and all the people want more of Jesus!

2) Jesus Rejects Rockstar Status

- A) The crowds find Jesus in the desert (4:42, desolate). The people reason that Jesus should come back to Capernaum, a ministry home-base which will catapult His popularity! The world will come to Capernaum and see Jesus! Makes sense, doesn't it? Maybe Jesus could teach in their synagogue, heal more people, make yesterday everyday (Mark 1:35-37)!
- B) The quiet and barren desert brings clarity for Jesus, a place where Jesus is positioned to connect with God. Popularity and fame aren't worth much in a desert. Following a sudden and profound time of intense ministry, the desert solitude provides a sanctuary for Jesus to enjoy relationship with God, and in the quiet silence the Son can hear the Father (Luke 4:42).
- C) Solitude and silence are like fertile soil, and this intentional communion with God is like rain in a desert, flooding into Jesus' soul. Jesus comes out of the desert with greater clarity and purpose, leading Him to reject an immediate return to Capernaum and any rockstar fame (cf. Mark 1:38).
- D) Jesus will not be identified with one place or with one group of people, but only by His identity as God's child, His Son. In the silence and solitude of the desert, God directs Jesus (as in 4:1) to make His purpose to proclaim the Gospel (good news) of the "kingdom of God" (4:43).

3) Dependence On Communion With Father God

- A) From the outset of His public ministry, Jesus moves with great power and authority (4:30, 32, 35, 39, 40-41) over the worldly kingdom of Satan (note 4:5-6). We are witnessing what our own lives can look like when they are moved by the pleasure of God for His children (see also 3:21-22).
- B) From the outset of His public ministry life, we also witness the source of Jesus' power and focus for ongoing ministry (4:44). His relationship with His Father draws Him into silence and solitude (before dawn!), to spend time talking with His Father, and listening to God's direction for His life.
- C) Jesus depends on His Father (Hebrews 5:7-9), in order to live His life obediently for purposes still not revealed! Jesus thirsted for time with His Father. The things of this world held no attraction for Jesus, because of His intentional communion with God (1 Corinthians 10:21-22).
- D) We are witnessing the source of real power in the life of Christ, but also the source of power over sin in our own lives. When we are intentional in our response to God, we seek Him in silence and solitude, and when we do, God promises power to His children (note James 5:13-18).

In-Depth

Read Luke 4:42-44

- Discuss what you learned from this week's sermon.
- 1. Verse 42: Jesus frequently retreated from the world around him to solitude with God. What do these verses tell us about dependence on God?
 - A. Hebrews 5:7-9
 - B. 1 John 2:15-17
- 2. Verse 43: Jesus "was sent for this purpose": to preach the good news of the kingdom of God. Jesus spoke of the kingdom to his last day on earth (Acts 1:1-3). What is "the kingdom of God? (See Luke 1:33; Luke 13:18-21; Luke 17:20-21; John 3:3-5; John 18:36; Revelation 11:15.)



- 3. The Kingdom of God (Matthew calls it the kingdom of heaven) is often spoken of as "already, but not yet" here. It has "already" begun with Jesus' first coming, but is "not yet" fully empowered until his second return. For each of the following, decide whether the passage is describing an "already" aspect of the kingdom or a "not yet" one:
 - A. Matthew 11:12
 - B. Matthew 12:28
 - C. 1 Corinthians 15:24
 - D. Acts 1:6-8
 - E. Revelation 12:10
 - F. Mark 1:14-15
 - G. Mark 9:1
