



- IV. **The lessons of God's forgiveness**, Luke 7:
- A. Feel the weight of your sin, Matthew 5:3-6; Revelation 3:17-18; Luke 5:31-32. When you see the totality of your sin, you can grasp the greatness of God's forgiveness.
- B. Reflect on your true spiritual condition, Psalm 51:6; John 4:23-24. Do not avoid it.
- C. Jesus claims the power to forgive sins. Who does that make him? Luke 7:48-49; 5:20-21.
- D. The woman responded to Jesus with a demonstration of love that was voluntary, personal, creative, original, costly, practical, humble and heartfelt. It was public and socially risky, yet was somehow anonymous! What can you learn from her example?
- E. Jesus had compassion for all, and stood with the outcasts. Are you with Jesus, or with Simon?

Themes Characteristic of Luke's Gospel (and Acts)

Themes prominent in Luke 7:36-50 are in **bold** type

food and feasting outcasts praise Gentiles Iesus as "Lord" joy Samaritans possessions **Iesus as "Son of God"** the Word of God women grace * the poor discipleship & servanthhood forgiveness persecution & suffering the Holy Spirit repentance Jerusalem as the key city faith angels use of the word "today" prayer peace the Church witness

the universal offer of the message of Jesus to all peoples

Christianity as non-subversive, not a threat to Jewish people or the Roman Empire; a tendency to defend Christianity from criticism

God's purpose achieved in spite of intense opposition

the religion of the Jewish people as the cradle of Christianity

miracles as the sign that the Age of Messiah is come

salvation, coming from God through Jesus Christ

the Kingdom of God: begun, but not fully realized the Church remaining in the world as Jesus' Second Coming is delayed

* present in Acts, but not as prominent as in Luke

The Purpose of Luke's Gospel: To STRENGTHEN FAITH in the LORD Jesus as the One through whom God has provided SALVATION for ALL PEOPLE, as proven by Jesus' WORDS and WORKS.
