# On The Job Training

# 1) Cross-Cultural Training

(Luke 10:1-11; cf. 9:1-6)

The sending out of the 72 two-by-two into the local towns is meant to be an "on-the-job" team training exercise, much like the training Jesus accomplished with 'the Twelve' earlier in Luke 9:1-6. First and foremost, Jesus desires His followers (the church) learn ministry by doing ministry.

# 2) Intentional Dependency

(Luke 10:3-4; Matthew 24:14; Revelation 7:9-12) The sending out of the 72 into a cross-cultural context illustrates God's heart of mercy and grace for all people groups of the world, especially as Christ heads to the cross in Jerusalem. Every Christ-follower needs active dependence – in prayer (vertical) and in relationship with one another (horizontal). In God's Kingdom, the number "one" is never singular. "One" is always inter-dependent unity.

# 3) Purposeful Follow-Up

(Luke 10:12-20)

The 72 are sent with a message of hope in the Gospel and also with a real-life motivation that life and death are genuinely in the balance. Choosing to "not listen" or to "not be aware" of the Gospel message results in eternal destruction. Ignorance or lack of knowledge does not excuse sin. God's people are on a genuine desperate rescue mission. Eternity hangs in the balance, nothing else is more important.

3B. What do Luke 10:12 and Luke 10:14, as well as Hebrews 10:29 imply about punishment in Hell?
