We will examine several contemporary aspects of life using video talks from the "Q" organization, and then discuss the subject using helpful tools and insights to help us share our faith in the world today.



- 1. Luke 10:21-22. Why might it be the Father's will to hide truth? Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-25. Can wisdom lead to God? Why?
- 2. Luke 10:25-28. Also read Mark 12:28-31. The scribe and Jesus both summarize God's Law in two commandments. How do these two accurately summarize the 10 Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17)?

A Color Blind Kingdom

1) Celebrating God's Gospel Being Revealed

(Luke 10:21-24; cf. Matthew 11:25-27, 13:16-17; also Isaiah 6:9-13; Luke 8:9-10; cf. Ephesians 2:12-22, Revelation 5:9-10, 7:9-17)

Jesus delights in the success of His 72 returning disciples (Luke 10:17-20), and pulls his own disciples close in even greater excitement for their unique witness of the fulfillment of God's Gospel promises "breaking into" both the Jewish & 'non-Jewish' (Gentile) world of Samaria.

2) Testing the Teacher

(Luke 10:25-28; cf. Matthew 22:34-40; Mark 12:28-34; Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Daniel 12:2; Leviticus 19:17-18)

A lawyer/scribe (closely related with the Pharisees) asks Jesus a fairly common/innocent question (note Luke 18:18ff), but with an intent to entrap Jesus. The "test" is technical, but with a flawed inquiry, 'What must I do to inherit salvation from eternal death, and be resurrected from the death by God for a future eternal life?' Jesus defers to the expert in the Law of Moses, affirming the lawyer's expertise & answer, and then hinges salvation on doing what the Law demands.

3) Uncomfortably Abundant Mercy

(Luke 10:29-37; Romans 7:13-20, 8:1-5) The lawyer wants his behaviors & eternal future publicly justified, so he asks another technical-but-flawed question. Jesus non-answers with an uncomfortable story containing an explosive conclusion. The lavish mercy of the "Good Samaritan" cuts deeply against cultural & religious prejudices. Jesus' story flips the lawyer's question and is a passionate call to find security in true faith through authentic displays of mercy.
