Relentless Generosity

1) Prayerfully Dependent Identity (Luke 11:1-4, Matthew 6:9-13)

The request from the Disciples for Jesus "to teach us to pray as John [the Baptist] taught his disciples" (Luke 11:1) illuminates a good desire to be identified by the unique prayers/habits/practices of the Master. Jesus' response is a compact & well crafted prayer (the Lord's Prayer) revealing an identity of honor, dependence, and gratefulness.

2) Shamelessly Persistent Prayers

(Luke 11:5-8; Matthew 15:21-28)

There are a variety of reasons we skip/avoid/ignore prayer. But this is not the way of Jesus Christ or His disciples. Jesus taught his disciples to urgently and shamelessly 'beat on God's door' in their prayers. As followers of God, Jesus both examples and teaches persistent prayer, even to the point of personal humiliation, as though God is actually God.

3) Fruitfully Generous Behaviors

(Luke 11:9-13; cf. Hebrews 8:5, 10:1-39)

Praying engages spiritual truth and spiritual realities, recognizing that the physical world we see, hear, and touch is a shadowy reflection of the eternal spiritual world which God graciously reveals. But, because we are "in the shadowlands," and our prayers feel as though they might 'fall on deaf ears,' Jesus assures us of God's exceeding goodness and abundant generosity. Simply stated – God is a good, good Father.

1D. The Lord's Prayer also exemplifies various relationships between God and the prayer that can shape our attitude when we pray. For example, father & child ("Our Father"); master & servant ("your will be done"). Which others can you identify?

Making It Relevant

Tonight we pray as Jesus did. Go through the Lord's Prayer as a group, one line at a time, praying a corresponding prayer.

Adoration: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name

-- Pray about what you love about who God is

Intercession: Your kingdom come

-- Pray for the world to know Jesus, those who spread the gospel, and those (family, neighbors, etc) who need Jesus

Submission: Your will be done

-- Pray that you would know and obey God's will for your life

Petition: Give us this day our daily bread

- -- Pray for your needs (physical, health, financial, etc)
- -- Pray for the needs of others (family, friends, neighbors)

Forgiveness: And forgive us our debts

-- Pray God would reveal sin in your life and forgive you

Transformation: As we have forgiven our debtors

-- Pray God would transform you to be more like Jesus

Protection: Lead us from temptation, deliver us from evil

- -- Pray for strength to overcome sin in your life
- -- Pray for the thwarting of evil in our world and protection from harm
