

God's Spirit Is For All People

1) The Promise of Something Faithful & Secure (Ezekiel 36:24-28; Ezra 1:1-4; Hosea 2:1-23)

At one time, God's 'Chosen People' (Israelites) lived in a prolonged exile far away from their homeland, which had been conquered and occupied by Assyrian (722 BCE) & Babylonian (605-597 BCE) invaders. Deported Israelite captives were eventually released by the Medo-Persian Empire (who had defeated the Babylonians, around 538-537 BCE), leading to a slow return of God's people to the Promised Land of Israel.

Israel's exile was deeply humbling for a proud people who came from the rich history of patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, Jacob; from great leaders Joseph, Moses, and Joshua; and the legendary Kings of Israel's United Kingdom: Saul, David, and Solomon. The exile was a clear sign of God's judgment and displeasure with Israel's adulterous rebellion. But God is faithful, and brings Light in unexpectedly gracious ways.


2) The Beginning of the Final Act (Acts 2:1-47; Luke 12:11-12; John 14:16-18, 25-29; 16:8-15;

Matthew 16:18; Ephesians 4:1-16, 3:10-14; Revelation 2:1-3:22)

In the Old Testament, Passover (remembering Israel's rescue out of Egypt), was followed by a "Feast of Weeks/Harvest" 50 days after the Passover. "Pentecost" (meaning "fiftieth") marked the beginning of harvest, and the offering of the "firstfruits of the harvest" to God.

Pentecost Sunday, observed 7 weeks after Christ's death & resurrection during Passover, is also the moment God poured out the 'fire' of His promised "Helper," the Spirit of God to equip and gift 'firstfruit' people, the establishment of His powerful end-times church.

The church is Christ's 'visible' body in the world, an ongoing Spirit-filled & gifted movement of grace-saturated Christ followers proclaiming God's continued promise of forgiveness from sin for the deepest purposes of an eternal family (inheritance, descendants, blessing).
