



BAPTISM AT LONG BEACH ALLIANCE

Some General Thoughts & Ideas About Baptism at LBAC

The Bible teaches that baptism is a response to receiving the free gift of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ (note the 'Gospel: God's Plan For Me'). Baptism is an outward symbol revealing new life in Jesus Christ. Baptism represents total identity with Jesus Christ. Because baptism is a response of someone who possesses faith in Christ, we do not baptize infants or anyone who cannot confess the indwelling of the Holy Spirit through relationship with Jesus Christ. We encourage those who were baptized as children or infants to be baptized as believing adults, as an expression of their own faith in God through Christ. We encourage baptism by a spiritual mentor, parent, or respected pastor. We will baptize someone in any location; home, beach, or at church. We encourage choosing a public location for baptism where those who have never believed can witness the miracle of a life changed, washed clean, and resurrected with Jesus Christ!

Who Can Be Baptized at LBAC?

- A) You MUST be born again, or born "from above" (John 3:3, 5, 1st John 1:9).
- B) You can be saved and not be baptized (Luke 23:39-43).
- C) Baptism was often associated IMMEDIATELY with salvation (Acts 2:38).

You DO NOT Have To Be Baptized to belong at LBAC, BUT...

- A) Jesus was baptized, identifying with us and showing a pattern for life (Matthew 3:13-17).
- B) Jesus commands His followers to be baptized (Matthew 28:19).
- C) All believers should follow Christ's example and be baptized (Acts 10:48, Mark 16:16).




