1) A Gospel Crisis of Freedom vs. Submission

- A. FROM THE BEGINNING OF HUMAN EXISTENCE, THERE HAS BEEN A BATTLE BETWEEN MANKIND'S DESIRE FOR FREEDOM FROM GOD VS. OUR SUBMISSION TO GOD'S DESIGN THAT WE REFLECT AND BEAR HIS IMAGE, AS CHILDREN OF OUR HEAVENLY FATHER.
- B. GENERALLY SPEAKING, MANKIND CRIES OUT TO GOD AND ASKS FOR HELP DURING TIMES OF CRISIS, BEGGING GOD FOR HIS FAVOR IN PROVIDING FREEDOM/RELEASE FROM A VARIETY OF NEGATIVE (SOMETIMES HORRIFIC) CIRCUMSTANCES INCLUDING ENEMIES, FAMINE, ADDICTIONS, FAMILY PAIN, ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES, SLAVERY, ETC.
- C. HOWEVER, WHEN GOD DELIVERS PEOPLE FROM TROUBLE, THEIR FAITHFULNESS TO SUBMIT TO GOD'S DESIGN IS USUALLY VERY SHORT-LIVED. STRANGELY, WHEN GOD DIRECTLY INTERVENES FOR PEOPLE IN HISTORY, THEY BECOME LESS FAITHFUL.
- D. SUBMISSION TO GOD IS OFTEN GREATEST WHEN HARDSHIP IS MOST INTENSE. SADLY, TIMES OF GREAT PERSONAL COMFORT AND FREEDOM OFTEN LEAD TO REBELLION. PASSIVITY. AND APATHY IN RESPONSE TO SUBMITTING TO GOD. THIS SO-CALLED FREEDOM FROM GOD LEADS MANKIND BACK INTO TROUBLE. AND BACK TO CRYING OUT FOR DELIVERANCE FROM GOD. THIS CYCLE SEEMS TO NEVER-END!
- E. HOW DOES GOD KEEP ENOUGH DISTANCE FROM MANKIND SO AS TO NOT TRIGGER OUR REBELLIOUS THIRST FOR INDEPENDENCE. WHILE STILL REMAINING CLOSE ENOUGH TO PROVIDE A WAY TO LIVE AS GOD THE FATHER'S IMAGE-REFLECTING CHILDREN? THE ANSWER TO THE QUESTION IS THE HOLINESS OF GOD.

### 2) The Holiness of God

- A. "HOLY" MEANS THAT SOMETHING OR SOMEONE IS "SET APART FROM ITS REGULAR USE OR PURPOSE FOR THE EXCLUSIVE PURPOSE OR USE OF GOD." I PREFER TO THINK OF HOLINESS AS "SET APART FROM THE WORLD FOR GOD'S GOOD PURPOSES."
- B. THERE ARE A FEW KEY WORDS IN THE BIBLE WHICH DESCRIBE "HOLINESS." "PERFECT." "PURE/PURITY." "COMPLETE." "SEPARATED/CUT OFF." "SANCTIFY/ SANCTIFICATION." AND AT TIMES. "GLORY." THESE ARE ALL DESCRIPTIONS OF HOLINESS. AND BECAUSE HOLINESS IS AN IMPORTANT CONCEPT IN THE BIBLE. I KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR THESE WORDS.

- C. GOD DESCRIBES HIMSELF AS COMPLETELY HOLY (LEVITICUS 11:44-45). IN OTHER WORDS, GOD IS COMPLETELY OTHER-THAN THIS WORLD. HE IS SEPARATE FROM THE WORLD, BEYOND IT, AND ALL HIS WAYS ARE HOLY (ISAIAH 55:8-9).
- D. GOD'S HOLINESS IS PROBABLY GOOD NEWS FOR MOST OF US. WHO WANTS TO FOLLOW AN IMPERFECT GOD? WHY BOTHER? RATHER, GOD IS THE ONE WHO KNOWS THE BEGINNING FROM THE END, AND WHO ALWAYS COMPLETES HIS PURPOSES IN PERFECTION AND IN HOLINESS (ISAIAH 46:10).
- E. BUT GOD'S HOLINESS IS ALSO BAD NEWS FOR ALL OF US. GOD EXPECTS THAT WE ARE HOLY, REFLECTING HIS PERFECT CHARACTER (MATTHEW 5:48) AND LIVING HOLY LIVES (1 PETER 1:16), WE HAVE TO BE HOLY BECAUSE GOD IS HOLY (LEVITICUS 20:7, 26, 1 PETER 1:13-16). BUT HOW?

### 3) God's Gift of Holiness

- A. THE GOOD NEWS OF THE BIBLE IS THAT GOD PROVIDES WHAT WE NEED. WHILE HE EXPECTS US TO BE PERFECT AND HOLY, HE ALSO KNOWS WE CANNOT ACCOMPLISH HOLINESS ON OUR OWN. THIS IS WHY GOD SENT JESUS CHRIST TO SEEK AND SAVE THE LOST (LUKE 19:10), WASHING US WHITE AS SNOW (ISAIAH 1:18),
- B. THROUGH JESUS, WE ARE MADE COMPLETELY CLEAN, HOLY, AND PURE. GOD'S (HOLY) SPIRIT WASHES US CLEAN (TITUS 3:5), REGENERATING US AND SEALING US FOR THE DAY OF REDEMPTION (EPHESIANS 1:13-14, 4:30).
- C. EVEN THE MOST CLUELESS AND CARNAL FOLLOWERS OF GOD IN THE BIBLE (THE CORINTHIAN CHURCH), WERE CALLED "HOLY ONES" OR "SAINTS" (I CORINTHIANS 1:2, 2 CORINTHIANS 1:1). IN THIS SENSE, WE ARE MADE HOLY. SIMPLY AS PART OF OUR IDENTITY IN JESUS CHRIST (I CORINTHIANS 6:11).
- D. OUR SECURITY IN CHRIST IS COMPLETE, AND PRODUCES THE GOOD FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT IN OUR LIVES AS PART OF OUR IDENTITY (GALATIANS 5:23-24). EVEN THOUGH WE ARE STILL "IN PROCESS," GOD SEES US IN CHRIST AS COMPLETELY HOLY (SANCTIFIED) PEOPLE, WELCOMED IN HIS PRESENCE (HEBREWS 10:19-25). THIS IS OUR "POSITIONAL SANCTIFICATION." OUR POSITION IN CHRIST (GALATIANS 2:20).
- E. BUT WE KNOW THERE IS MORE! OUR JOURNEY IS NOT COMPLETE, BECAUSE THE HOLY SPIRIT PROMISES TO COMPLETE THE WORK HE HAS STARTED (PHILIPPIANS 1:6). THIS IS JUST THE BEGINNING OF OUR PROGRESS TOWARD BECOMING MORE LIKE JESUS CHRIST (ROMANS 12:1-2). THIS IS THE EXCITING JOURNEY OF OUR SPIRITUAL FORMATION AT WORK THROUGH THE REST OF OUR LIVES!

A. Read Revelation 4:8. Define "holy" in your own words. In what ways is God "Holy, holy, holy?"

B. Read Genesis 2:3; Exodus 3:5; Exodus 19:6; Exodus 28:2; Exodus 28:38; Exodus 29:37; Exodus 30:31-32. What does it mean that these things are holy? How did these ordinary things become holy?

#### 2. Sanctification

A. Sanctification is an intimidating looking word. What does it mean?

B. Read 1 Corinthians 1:2; 1 Corinthians 6:11; Romans 3:21-22; 2 Corinthians 5:21. In one sense, we are already sanctified. How is this possible?

C. What are the implications of this "positional sanctification?" (Read Romans 6:14,17-18; Galatians 5:16-18)

D. Read Romans 6:19; 2 Corinthians 3:18; Hebrews 12:1; 1 Peter 1:14-16. These (and many other) verses say we are not yet sanctified. How does this "progressive sanctification" differ from what we discussed above?

E. Read 1 Thessalonians 5:23; 1 Corinthians 15:49; Revelation 21:27. When is our sanctification complete?
