



Individual Laments: "I" – the psalmist speaks on behalf of himself

The "Penitential Psalms": individual laments that express a deep sense of sin: 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143.

The "Imprecatory Psalms": laments asking God to judge enemies: 7, 35, 55, 58, 69, 79, 109, 137, 139.

Community Laments: "we" - the psalmist speaks on behalf of Israel

LAMENT STRUCTURE

The Laments employ this basic pattern, usually with some variation.

- Address to God ("O God . . .")
- II. Complaint ("For . . . ")
- III. Confession of Trust
- IV. Petition
- V. Words of Assurance, or Exhortation to Praise, or Vow of Praise

When you study a Lament, it is helpful to identify which of the above sections are present, or absent, and in what order.

Psalm 31: Wordplay

The author is fond of using a word in the first part of the psalm, then repeating it later, often in a very different context. In doing so, he is inviting the reader to compare how the significance of the word changes in the two (or three) contexts in which it appears.
