

GOSPEL GLADIATORS

"GOD'S JUDGMENTS ARE IMPARTIAL"

LONG BEACH ALLIANCE CHURCH - SEPTEMBER XXIX, MMXIX - ROMANS II:1-XI- PASTOR CHRIS LANKFORD

I) THE GOSPEL REVEALS GOD'S WRATH

- A. There is confidence and pride in the power of the Gospel because it provides salvation for all who believe and receive the righteousness of God through faith in Christ (Romans 1:16-17).
- B. The presence of Gospel power reveals that all of mankind is under the wrath of God (John 3:17-21). The wrath of God is not part of the Gospel, but the Gospel is like a bright light, illuminating mankind's true condition of sin & God's judgment (Romans 1:18).
- C. At the heart of Gospel living is faith. But mankind's story is not one of faith in God (1:18). Even though mankind "knew God," they ignored Him, so God withdrew and left mankind to futile, foolish, and darkened "knowing;" resulting in idolatry (1:21-23).
- D. Idolatry attempted to fill a spiritual void where God used to be known and honored. But mankind's independence from God led to further spiritual darkness, resulting in sexually impure idolatry and broad dishonor among mankind (1:24-25).
- E. Mankind's ongoing retreat from God resulted in increasing darkness and self-serving (idolatrous) sexual desires; a warping of God's creation design for heterosexual intimacy (reflecting God's image), and replacing it with homosexual intimacy (an obscuring of God's image, 1:26-27).
- F. Mankind's idolatry reaches its apex when knowledge of God is gone, and mankind explores every self-serving and self-reflecting evil, to the extent that they worship their own independent actions as though they were worshipping themselves (1:28-32).
- G. The "story" of God's revealed wrath is not just the "big" story of man's historical dishonoring of God, but it is also the story of every person's descent into darkness who chooses idols over honoring God. This is the story of all men, perhaps even ourselves (1:18-32).

H. Further, this story about "them" (note the third-person references) was the popular typical "attitude" of the Jewish nation toward those who were outsiders; the Gentile nations -- for instance those who were in Rome or were from Greco-Roman heritage (note the Apocryphal 'Wisdom of Solomon' 12-16, esp. 15:1-6, 16:9-12). This "sets up" the next part of the letter...

II) WHY SO JUDGMENTAL?

- A. Just when you are rooting for God's justice and His "righteous decree" of eternal judgment against evil-doing everywhere... Everything suddenly changes! Now the focus sharpens onto all who judge (one another) with shocking impact (Romans 2:1-5).
- B. Is there no escape from all of this?! We are either under wrath from idolatry, or we are under wrath for hypocrisy! And God is leaving you and I alive so we will repent (2:4), but for what result?
- C. The question is quickly answered (Romans 2:6-11). Each one will be judged, not by one another (2:1), but by God who is completely impartial, unlike hypocritical human judges (2:11).
- D. What is the result of this impartial judgment of a wrathful God who seems to have lots of wrath (so far), and a very light sprinkling of Gospel hope (so far)? The news is fairly bleak. All people will be judged according to their own "works" or deeds (2:6).
- E. The result of judgment has only two outcomes. Eternal life & peace (2:7, 10) or wrath (again), fury, tribulation, & distress (2:8-9).
- F. So, how do you get in on the eternal life deal? It's actually simple: Just live a life of patient selflessness, and do good works which reflect glory, honor, and have eternally immortal quality (2:7, 10).
- G. And if you fail, well... Judgment will not be very kind to those of you who live selfishly, do not obey truth, and choose to do things which fall short of eternal immortal perfection (2:8-9).
- H. So there you are, it's your day! You stand before God Almighty, a perfect and impartial judge (2:11). What will happen next in your life? Will it be peace or will it be distress (2:9-10)?
