# Hopeful Preparation

# 1) Advent Trusts God For The Future In Our Pain

- A) The OT prophets often warned of a still-yet-future 'Day of the Lord.' The Day of the Lord would be characterized by wrath and doom for mankind, but especially those who lacked faith in God (Ezekiel 30:2-4; Joel 2:1-11; Zephaniah 1:14-16). The terror over the Day led the prophets to deliver fearful warnings (Amos 5:18-20).
- B) Despite this, the hearts of God's people ached for *the Day* and advent of their long-awaited Messiah because *that Day* would also deliver God's people from injustice (Jeremiah 33:14-18; Malachi 4:1-3). The *coming Day* was actually eagerly anticipated because it would establish God's righteous judgment and bring peace and the unopposed reign of God's Kingdom forever (Isaiah 2:2-4, 12-17, 60:15-16).
- C) Largely due to circumstances including oppression and exile, the people of God tunnel-visioned their focus about the *Day of the Lord* onto the nationalistic promises of military might and victory and the political supremacy which came from God's favor and love for Israel (Zephaniah 3:14-20; Zechariah 14:12-19).
- D) The anticipation of "post-apocalyptic hope" became so blinding for God's followers that the purposes of God's goodness and justice and the call to prepare for Messiah in purity were obscured and seldom understood. God's people actually became blinded to the nature and character of their Messiah (Isaiah 9:6-7, 42:1-9, 53:7-12), and because of their history of pain and present circumstances, missed His arrival!

# 2) Advent Is A Time For Joyful Anticipation

- A) We can learn a lot from the OT exiles who eagerly desired that Messiah would come. We are also called to live as faithful exiles in purity and eager anticipation of the advent of the Messiah, Jesus Christ (Philippians 3:17-21). Like the Jews, we also live in the great tension between judgment and reward (Matthew 25:31-46).
- B) However, our celebration is not in an unknown future Messiah, it is in Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord, and in our full identity in Christ's life, death, and resurrection (Hebrews 1:1-4; Galatians 2:20; Colossians 1:15-23, 27-29).
- C) Knowing our lives belong to Christ calls us to unity (James 5:7-8), and an eager welcome for the perfect timing of Christ's return (2 Peter 3:12-13; Revelation 22:20), not even fearing death if it comes before Jesus' return (1 Corinthians 15:54-57).
- D) This is the greatest appreciation of Christmas we can have, to live with joy and faith in freedom as we are transformed by beholding (once again) the perfection of God revealed in flesh for all mankind to see (2 Corinthians 3:17-18; John 1:1-3, 14, 16-18)!
