1) Joy Flows From Hope In God's Love

- A) The Psalms are the "song book" of Israel; five smaller sections (1-41, 42-72, 73-89, 90-106, 107-150) joyously concluding with the five "Hallelujah" Psalms (146-150).
- B) These last five Psalms are notable because of their form (they all begin and conclude with "Hallel-u-jah"), and also because of their composition following the post-exile (post-relocated-POW's) time period in Israel's history.
- C) The Hallelujah-Psalms (Psalm 146-150) become, for New Testament followers of Jesus, a wonderful and compact guide for joyfully experiencing God in the midst of brokenness, difficulties, and circumstances beyond our control.
- D) Further, these Psalms are exemplary as Advent Psalms, looking forward to the return of the King. Intentional worship (Psalm 146:1-4) reflects on God's character (146:5-10) bringing hope (146:5) because of God's loving promises (146:6-9), resulting in a fullness of joy and worship (146:10).

2) God's Loving Faithfulness Provides Authentic Joy

- A) A wonderful example of Advent hope and joy (despite wildly difficult to explain circumstances) is also provided by Mary, mother of Jesus Christ. Her "Magnificat" (from "mega-loonoh," to magnify), is a wondrous NT 'Psalm' (Luke 1:46-55).
- B) Mary's "magnifying God" response (1:46-47), despite her life-altering and difficult circumstances (Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38), hopes in God's faithful provision (1:50-55) joyfully anticipating the coming Messiah (1:48-49).
