

I) THE BENEFITS OF BEING DECLARED RIGHTEOUS IN JESUS CHRIST

- A. Through the recounting of some of the central faith stories from the life of 'our Father Abraham,' the Apostle Paul convincingly illustrates that the righteousness of Abraham (cf. Genesis 15:5-6) was not based on Abraham's obedience to the Law (which had not yet been given). Rather, it was Abraham's faith response to God which led to his 'righteous standing' in the heart/eyes of God (Romans 4:13-22).
- B. In a subtly nuanced shift to first-person-plural language (ours, we, us) we are drawn into the drama of God's eternal promises to Father Abraham and the Jews, no longer as observers, but now as those who can also be included in God's eternal promises through faith in Jesus Christ (Romans 5:1).
- C. Many followers of Jesus Christ will naively stop right here. Justification by faith. Declared righteous by God. The moment of salvation when a person appropriates/receives (by faith) the blood of Jesus Christ's sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins and in the hope of inclusion in the promise of eternal life with God in Heaven (Romans 3:23-25)
- D. But, it DOES NOT STOP THERE! There is <u>much more</u>! In a series of superlative phrases, Paul rejoices in the believer's access to more and more of God's amazing grace! Justification by faith is not just for eternity, it provides ongoing and increasing benefits for life <u>today</u> (Romans 5:2)!
- E. Two 'salvation benefits' flowing from God's grace into our lives are captured by "rejoice in hope" (Romans 5:2): Joy, grateful pride in God's glory of victory in Jesus Christ. <u>Hope</u>, firm confidence in God's integrity and the increase and expansion of God's glory (his identity and character) in fulfillment of all His future promises (Romans 5:2).

- F. Significantly, joy and hope originate from our justification by faith in Jesus Christ. We live in a culture that encourages "choosing joy" and "choosing hope," but true joy and genuine hope cannot be fabricated. These attributes are responses to God's grace. Without God's grace, there is no lasting joy or authentic hope for humanity. Without Jesus, these qualities are only temporary shadows of what God intends for you and me.
- G. When joy flows from the source of God's declaration of righteousness (our identity in Christ), we can rejoice in all circumstances (Romans 5:3-5, see also James 1:2-4), even growing into greater maturity and hope in the Gospel because we experience the love of God "poured into our hearts" (the person of Christ) by the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:1-2).
- H. Do not miss the fullness of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit -- all at work in our lives in order to bring us into relationship with God! Even when we did not know or see God, even while we were living in sinful weakness, even while we lived in rebellion against God -- He still loved us and even died, pouring out his blood for us in order to provide us God's declaration of justification (Romans 5:6-9).
- I. And so, the Apostle Paul illuminates for us, if God saved us while we were completely dead in our sins, "how much more" will we be saved (looking toward the future) now that we are "reconciled to God" (Romans 5:10). The language of our salvation by God shifts from legal terms (justification) to relational terms (reconciliation), and from the place of being enemies of God (mutual hostility) to peace with God (mutual love) and "more than that," terms of mutual joy (Romans 5:10-11) which flow from a reconciled relationship.
