

I) GRACE IS GREATER THAN SIN FOR TODAY AND TOMORROW

- A. The provision of grace is infinite! There is no way to "out-sin" the grace of God for the person who has faith in Jesus Christ! Grace always wins, providing both righteousness and eternal life (Romans 5:20-21)!
- B. Justification by faith declares one righteous by God. Since God's grace is provided abundantly ("all the more" Romans 5:20), it makes sense that a person could sin (a lot more than a lot more), and Christ's sacrifice on the cross still covers the sin (Romans 6:1). Right?
- C. Have you ever thought something like that in your life? Have you ever thought that since God's grace is abundant, God has obligated Himself to forgiving you? Is God obligated to forgive you and me? Can we go on sinning, knowing that God's grace covers all our sin (Romans 6:1)?
- D. In the most absolute and strongest possible manner, the Apostle Paul roars out "ABSOLUTELY NOT!" (6:2). Our identity "in Christ" is not only an eternal reality, but is also "much more" (5:17) for living right now! In other words (as commentator Douglas Moo puts it), "Christ's death "on our behalf" (Romans 5:6-8) frees us not only from the **penalty** of sin but from the **power** of sin also."
- E. Up to now, Paul has been most concerned with establishing "justification by faith," our identity in Christ, focusing on the *penalty* of sin. But now, the focus shifts to 'sanctification' (holy living, purity, righteousness). Sanctification flows out from our justification, and is most concerned with solving the problem of the *power* of sin in our daily lives. The Westminster Catechism notes that in justification, we are pardoned from sin, but in sanctification, sin is subdued.



II) BEING FOR TODAY LEADING TO DOING FOR TOMORROW

- A. In the same manner that being comes before doing, justification is the source from which sanctification flows. Our identity is revealed in our actions, or in spiritual lives, our justification is revealed in our sanctification.
- B. Salvation is not just for eternity! It is for life today as well! God provides power for living out the wonder of our justification so we can "walk in the newness of life" (Romans 6:4) and live out a 'resurrection life of freedom' in Christ (Romans 6:5-8).
- C. Playing on some common concepts, the Apostle Paul notes that the resurrection life of the Christ-follower is marked by the "death of death" in their lives (Romans 6:8-11). Phrased differently, since death is the result of sin, and Christ has provided us freedom from sin by His death on the cross, we are now "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (6:11).
- D. Rather than following rules, which only lead to failure, God gives us a new "Spirit-nature" (Romans 5:5) leading to a new life of abundant obedience to Christ flowing from our reconciled relationship (Romans 6:12-14).
- E. In a series of imperative commands, Paul calls on Christ-followers to live out of their identity, rather than fall back into a rule-following cycle of failure. Quite literally, we take each part of our lives (internally and externally, Romans 6:13) and give them to God for His purposes. We no longer live according to old rules, but according to the abundant resurrection life given to each follower of Christ by God's grace (6:14)!
- F. So many questions arise! We have shifted from justification to sanctification, and with it the substance of living by the power of the Spirit **TODAY** with **TOMORROW** in view!
