# GOSPEL GLADIATORS "THE SPIRIT IS LIFE!"

LONG BEACH ALLIANCE CHURCH . FEBRUARY XVI, MMXX . ROMANS VIII:1-XI . PASTOR CHRIS LANKFORD

#### I) THE WRETCHED RESULTS OF GOOD INTENTIONS & GOOD WORKS

- A. After carefully weaving through numerous negative examples (carnal debauchery, 6:1-14; antinomian libertinism, 6:15-23; abusive slavery, 6:16-23; and loveless marriage, 7:1-6), the Apostle Paul shifts his focus onto his personal recollections with his Jewish 'brothers' (Romans 7:1, 4).
- B. As only a religious insider can, Paul unites his heart with those who live with a sincere dedication to good rules and holy laws (7:12) in an earnest pursuit of spiritual success derived from 'a pure/holy intention to honor God with honorably good works' (7:5, 8-9).
- C. Paul's unity with his fellow Jews is not meant for refuge, but rather Paul leverages his ethnic and religious background to expose that even for those with the greatest advantages, sin exploits human strengths and weaknesses (the "flesh," 7:5, 14, 18) with deadly savagery and a sophisticated supra-human diversifying power to virally spread the malignancy of sin through the 'spiritual' and 'pagan' alike (7:10-11).
- D. No one can escape. Like someone awake while being buried alive, the horror and desperation of sincerely hoping we can somehow escape the coffin of spiritual death and the suffocating weight of sin through our 'hard work' or by identifying as 'spiritual' is ludicrous (7:15-23).
- E. Like a nuclear explosion, Paul screams out against his wretched and hopeless condition (7:24). Dead and buried in sin, he primal-cries out for salvation, and God answers personally in Jesus Christ (7:25)! In one of the singularly most triumphant transitions in the whole Bible, the ancient problem of human condemnation (5:16) is erased in Jesus (8:1)!

#### II) THE WONDER AND SUPERIORITY OF LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

A. God rescues us from our hopelessness and wretched condition by giving us the free gift of Jesus Christ (8:1-11) which can only be received through trust/faith (repent in faith & follow in faith, 6:23) in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (8:3-4, 11).

- B. When we receive the free gift of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ, we are also "sealed" or "enveloped" (like securing/sealing an envelope, cf. Revelation 5:1) by the Spirit of God (Ephesians 1:13, 4:30). This is the great promise from Jesus Christ for all His disciples, our peace-filling confidence in God & Christ (cf. John 14:16, 26-27, 16:7-15)!
- C. Contrasted against a wretched life in the flesh (Romans 7:15-24), a life of faith trusts in the provision of the Holy Spirit, and brings to life the ability to live righteously, to actually live spiritually alive by faith (a life of faithful submission to Christ, 8:10). This confidence in God the Son and the provision of God the Spirit given by God our Father is foundational!
- D. Once a person becomes a "Christian" by faith, they no longer identify themselves as a person who has a "sin nature" or a person who lives "in the flesh." "YOU ARE NOT IN THE FLESH BUT IN THE SPIRIT" (8:9). Don't climb back into the coffin! You now have a "Spirit nature" which speaks God's Word of Jesus Christ into your soul!
- E. Your identity is important! Do you identify yourself as a "sinner" or a person with a "sin nature?" Paul attacks this concept in Romans 8:1, "THERE IS THEREFORE NOW NO CONDEMNATION FOR THOSE WHO ARE IN CHRIST JESUS..." This is our confidence for tomorrow (8:11), but more than that it is our confidence today! Jesus is not just life in the future, but for life eternally (now and forever), for your mortal body and your spirit (8:11)!
- F. Here's my final question: If the devil had the goal of getting Christians to live as though they really don't make a difference, as though they just don't matter to God (remember that line from Genesis 2:4-5?!), like Christians are actually powerless and useless what would be the most clever method for achieving such a goal?
- G. Would distracting you from your identity work? Would convincing you that you are a sinner rather than a chosen child of God work? What if he just bent your identity in Christ, just a little? Would it work to neuter your effectiveness? To take you out of the Christian life for long periods of time? What about you? Is your identity a "Spirit nature" or is it something else? Who are you (authentically) in Christ?
