Luke 2:1-6

¹ In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth.

Matthew 2:13-15

But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? ⁴² Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the offspring of David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" ⁴³ So there was a division among the people over him. ⁴⁴ Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him.

⁴⁵ The officers then came to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" ⁴⁶ The officers answered, "No one ever spoke like this man!" ⁴⁷ The Pharisees answered them, "Have you also been deceived? ⁴⁸ Have any of the authorities or the Pharisees believed in him? ⁴⁹ But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed." ⁵⁰ Nicodemus, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, ⁵¹ "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" ⁵² They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and see that no prophet arises from Galilee."

⁷ Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. ¹⁰ In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation* for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us.

1 John 3:16-18

¹⁶ By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. ¹⁷ But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? ¹⁸ Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

1 John 5:3-5

³ For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome. ⁴ For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. ^{*}The word "propitiation" means "a removal of wrath by the offering of a gift" or "a forgiveness that involves the putting away of wrath." Many translators are uncomfortable attributing character qualities to God such as "wrath" or "personal anger," preferring a more impersonal word such as "expiation" to describe God being "appeased by means of a gift." However, "expiation" is an impersonal word (you expiate a thing, a crime or a sin) and renders forgiveness for sins as an impersonal process of cause & effect, rather than "God's personal and vigorous opposition to evil in human beings" which is "put away" by the (very personal) act of Christ accomplished for God's glory on behalf of humanity. There are four important NT passages to consider: Romans 3:25, tells of Christ Jesus "whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins." According to Hebrews 2:17, [Christ] "had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people." In 1 John 2:2; 4:10, Christ is called "the propitiation for our sins." Each of these passages puts forward the thought that God's opposition to sin is more than token, it is more than impersonal. His wrath is exercised toward those who sin. But in that situation Christ is the answer; He provides the means of averting the divine wrath. It is this that the NT writers have in mind when they speak of propitiation. If God's wrath is not put away from us personally, than our salvation is nothing more than a ticket into God's dwelling place, and lacks God's personal love and mercy for those who are His own "adopted children" (Romans 8:15-17). We must conclude that Christ's "propitiation for our sins" is an intimate and personal element in Christianity we dare not surrender!
