1) The Perfect Match Of Providence And Prayer

- A) The Bible teaches us that God knows everything (1st John 3:20). God knows the past, the present, and the future.
- B) God the Son, Jesus Christ, created all things and keeps all things held together (Colossians 1:16-17). Nothing escapes God's notice, He is holding it all together!
- C) In the midst of this, Jesus Christ calls on His followers to pray (Matthew 6:9ff). Prayer is not just for meals or special moments, prayer is supposed to be a consistent and continual habit (1st Thessalonians 5:17).

- D) Why should we pray? Does prayer make a difference? The overwhelming answer of Scripture is **ABSOLUTELY!** Prayer transforms people and events (Luke 11:5-13).
- E) How is this possible? How can people cause change through prayer (James 5:16) when God has exhaustively predestined the universe (Ephesians 1:3-6)?
- F) Clearly, the answer is a tremendous mystery for mankind (1st Corinthians 2:7, cf. Ephesians 1:9). Somehow, God is able to "predestine change" in His universe.
- G) These two things seem as opposites for the mind of mankind, but clearly they are not opposites for God (cf. 2nd Kings 20, 1st Samuel 15:11 (note clarifying addition in 15:29), Genesis 6:5-6).

2) An Important Interpretive Application

- A) Just because we can read about and articulate God's characteristics (His "omni's"), does not mean that we understand how they work (Isaiah 55:8-9).
- B) We observe what God has revealed to us, our view is limited (1st Corinthians 13:12). God knows and observes everything, He is the limitless "omni-" creator (Isaiah 40:28).
- C) Followers of Jesus Christ should respond with deep security and confidence in the power and knowledge of God, because God is completely good and loving (Psalm 73:28, cf. Romans 12:1-2).

3) What Is Changed By Prayer?

- A) Clearly, prayer can change events. What kind of events? Here are just a few...
 - i) Weather (James 5:17, cf. 1st Kings 17:1).
 - ii) Childbearing (1st Samuel 1:11, 19-20, 27).
 - iii) Politics (2nd Samuel 15:31, 17:14, 23).
 - iv) Rulers (1st Samuel 10:22, 12:19).
 - v) Military battles (1st Samuel 23:2).
 - vi) Long life (2nd Kings 20:5, Isaiah 38:5).
 - vii) Blessing (1st Chronicles 4:10).
 - viii) Healing (James 5:16).
 - ix) Life & Death (John 11:40-44).
 - ix) Salvation (Romans 10:1).
- B) From small things to big things, from things with eternal consequences to things with short term consequences, God calls on us to engage Him in prayer (Philippians 4:6).
- C) Jesus Christ taught that we should be bold and persistent in our prayers, not giving up but asking, seeking, knocking -- showing persistence (Luke 11:5-13).
- D) While prayer changes events (which is important), God is most interested in changing the hearts of people (Jeremiah 31:33, cf. Hebrews 8:10).
