- E) Solomon speaks directly to his future bride calling her a dove. Solomon shows <u>GENTLENESS</u> and <u>UNDERSTANDING</u> for his future bride (2:14). He is promising to <u>PROTECT</u> and <u>SACRIFICE</u> for her well being!
- F) Engagement is a time of <u>VULNERABILITY</u> and <u>TRUST</u> <u>BUILDING</u>. There is no place for secrets or hidden past history between a couple who is engaged to be married. Secrets are a cancer to relationships, they will eventually kill.

G) There are "little foxes" (conflicts -- 2:15) during a time of courtship and engagement which must be handled. Engagement is a time to develop <u>GREAT CONFLICT</u> <u>RESOLUTION</u> skills. Learn to <u>FIGHT CLEAN</u>!

## 4) Passion & Purity For The Engaged Couple

- A) The Shulammite girl says <u>YES!</u> (2:16) and affirms the exclusivity of love which is reserved for the two of them alone. She day-dreams of a time when love between her and Solomon will be freely expressed (2:16-17).
- B) The Shulammite girl lives in <u>GREAT ANTICIPATION OF</u> <u>HER WEDDING DAY</u> (3:1). She dreams of her fiancé, and desires the <u>SECURITY OF MARRIAGE</u> which it will bring (3:1-4). She desires to give herself to her husband (3:4).

C) Even in her dreams, **PURITY** and **RESTRAINT** are in the forefront of her heart and mind (3:5). Like the scene she has already experienced in 2:7, she dreams of Solomon **PROTECTING HER PURITY AND GUARDING HER HEART** with the wedding day and marriage in mind (3:5)!

## Purity In Engagement

I ADJURE YOU, O DAUGHTERS OF JERUSALEM, BY THE GAZELLES OR BY THE HINDS OF THE FIELD, THAT YOU WILL NOT AROUSE OR AWAKEN MY LOVE UNTIL SHE PLEASES. ~SONG OF SONGS 3:5 (NASB)

- 1) Solomon & His Shulammite Bride's Relationship
  - A) After attraction to Solomon, the Shulammite girl sought GODLY CHARACTER, CHRISTLIKE REPUTATION, SERVANTHOOD, and OPEN/HONEST characteristics (Song of Songs 1:1-7)

THE REAL PROPERTY AND

- B) As courtship ensues, Solomon cultivates <u>RESPECT</u> by showing <u>HIGH REGARD</u> and <u>PRIDE</u> in his future bride. Solomon shows <u>VERBAL KINDNESS</u> and is courting her <u>EXCLUSIVELY</u> (1:8-11, 15, 2:2).
- C) The Shulammite girl experiences a courtship filled with an ENVIRONMENT OF ROMANCE in the midst of PUBLIC PRIDE AND LOVE. She experiences SECURITY & PROTECTION, all of which raises her SELF-WORTH & VALUE (1:12-14, 16-17, 2:1, 3-4).

 D) As their courtship develops, desire is heightened and, as God has designed, the desire for sexual intimacy increases (2:5-6). Note that Solomon **PROTECTS PURITY AND GUARDS THE HEART** of his bride and himself (2:7)!

## 2) The Goal Of Courtship -- When Are You Ready?

- A) As a final "stage" of courtship which leads toward the goal of marriage, is a period of engagement. An "engagement" is a short period of time (no more than 6 months) where the couple officially announce their intent to be married, and plan for their wedding ceremony & honeymoon.
- B) Who should become engaged? A couple who are prepared to reflect Ephesians 5:15-6:4. The kind of couple...
  - i. Who show **SUCCESS IN CHRISTLIKE COURTSHIP** through **PATIENT DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR RELATIONSHIP**.
  - ii. Who are prepared for a **HEALTHY DEPARTURE FROM PARENTAL AUTHORITY**. While still called to honor parents, the new family **LEAVES AND CLEAVES**.
  - iii. Who can successfully become **FINANCIALLY INDEPENDENT**.
  - iv. Led by a man who ENTHUSIASTICALLY LOVES HIS FUTURE BRIDE AS CHRIST LOVES THE CHURCH (SACRIFICIALLY). A man who INITIATES SPIRITUALLY with his future bride.
  - where the woman <u>RESPECTS AND JOYFULLY</u> <u>SUBMITS TO HER FUTURE HUSBAND AS UNTO THE</u> <u>LORD (RESPONSIVELY)</u>. A woman who <u>WILLINGLY</u> <u>PARTICIPATES IN SPIRITUAL MATTERS</u> with her future husband.
  - vi. Who can provide a <u>CHRIST-CENTERED HOME FOR</u> <u>CHILDREN</u> if God so blesses.

- C) Parental blessing before engagement (cf. Song of Songs 3:11) is critical! As is symbolic of the authority of a father over his family, a man should ask the father of the girl for her hand in marriage as a recognition of God's plan for "leaving and cleaving" (Genesis 2:24; Ephesians 5:31).
- D) Remember at each point in the process of any relationship, the goal is to develop habits and practices which last a lifetime. Behaving one way to "win the girl/guy" and a whole different way "once married" is a recipe for disaster!

## 3) A Memorable Engagement For The Couple

- A) The Shulammite girl is living in **GREAT ANTICIPATION** of Solomon coming to her to receive her for marriage (ask for her hand in marriage). She knows it is coming, but she doesn't know when (Song of Songs 2:8-9).
- B) The Shulammite girl experienced **INCREASING DESIRE**, even imagining Solomon peering through her windows wanting to see her, "standing behind our wall...," "looking through the windows...," peering through the lattice..." (2:9).
- C) Solomon does arrive to **ROMANTICALLY** and **RESPECTFULLY** ask the Shulammite girl to be his bride (2:10-13). **THOUGHT** and **ELOQUENCE** have gone into his invitation!
- D) We hear Solomon's words through the ears of the Shulammite girl, "...the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers...," "pruning the vines...," "the turtledove...," "ripened figs..." (2:11-13). Their courtship is compared to the wintertime, as Solomon invites her to a relationship full of LIFE, LOVE, and ABUNDANCE, a life like the springtime!
