## **Remembering Human Sinfulness, Remembering Divine Grace**

Ephesians 2:1-10

The Main Lesson: We are saved by grace! Part I. The Message of Human Sinfulness (Ephesians 2:1-3)	<ul> <li>Part II. The Message of Divine Grace (Ephesians 2:4-10)</li> <li><i>We are saved by grace!</i></li> <li>We can't save ourselves. We totally depend on God's grace.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li><i>We are <u>saved</u> by grace!</i></li> <li>We are spiritually dead in sin. We need to be saved.</li> <li><b>1)</b> A <u>difficult</u> message: Human sinfulness isn't a message that people want to hear. They will often try to deny it.</li> </ul>	1) A <u>shocking</u> message (v. 4): "But God!" These two words cut through the darkness of our despair and breathe unforeseen life into our hearts. The remedy for our death was nothing less than a miraculous, spiritual resurrection.		
2) A <i>necessary</i> message: In God's presence and in light of his word, human sinfulness is undeniable. (See Isaiah 6:1-7; Ephesians 2:11-12)	2) A <u>Christ-centered</u> message (vv. 5-6): This spiritual resurrection was provided for us "in Christ," that is, through our being united with him. (See Ephesians 1:3-14, 18-20; 3:20; also, take note of the gray highlighting in the diagram)		
3) A <u>blunt and bleak</u> message (v. 1): Paul doesn't try to sweeten this message up. He very clearly and very directly reminds the Ephesians that they were <u>spiritually dead</u> —alienated from God and trapped in a twisted mess of evil. (See Ephesians 4:17-19; Acts 19:17-20; 26:16-18)	3) An <u>eternal</u> message (v. 7): When we are united with Christ, we immediately experience God's grace. However, God's expression of his grace and our worshipful response is a process that will endure for all eternity.		
<ul> <li>4) A <i>multifaceted</i> message (vv. 2-3): The Ephesians' (and our) preconversion condition has three main elements:</li> <li>1. The world (v. 2b)</li> <li>2. The devil (v. 2c-e)</li> <li>3. The fact (v. 2c-e)</li> </ul>	4) A <u>humbling</u> message (vv. 8-9): This drama of redemption was God's plan (see Ephesians 1:4-5, 11; 3:11). It was God who initiated it and it is God who will carry it to completion. For our part, we are simply to trust in his saving work. (See 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Titus 3:4-7)		
<ul> <li>3. The flesh (v. 3a-c)</li> <li>5) A <u>universal</u> message: Paul says this message is true of his mainly Gentile readers (v. 1a), true of himself &amp; his fellow Jews (v. 3a), and true of everyone else (v. 3e). (See Romans 3:1-20)</li> </ul>	5) An <u>inspiring</u> message (v. 10): This is a message that calls us to action. We're not saved <u>by</u> works; we're saved <u>for</u> works. Just as God chose us before the foundation of the world (Ephesians 1:4-5), so also he has prepared work in advance for us to do. (See Ephesians 4:1; Luke 7:36-50—especially vv. 42-43 and 47)
