 - 1. Cain could have been reconciled both to God and his brother through repentance.
- b. From Jacob and Esau
 - i. The older shall serve the younger: Genesis 25:22-23
 - ii. Mercy is God's sovereign choice: Romans 9:11-16
- c. From Joseph and the Ten
 - i. The older shall serve the younger.
 - ii. What the brothers meant for evil, God meant for good: Genesis 50:20
 - iii. God intended to protect and provide for all the brothers through one of the brothers.

- a. I was surprised..."Be Reconciled": Matthew 5:23-24; I John 4:20
- b. The older serves the younger: I Corinthians 10:6, 11; Romans 3:1-2
 - i. Let's be like Joseph: Psalm 133:1
