Looking Upl

In Deuteronomy 6, Moses establishes statutes, commandments, and rules, leading to successful family living as Israel prepares to enter into the promised land. Why does he begin with "fearing the Lord," and what does this mean?

What are some of the benefits resulting from an outflow of fearing the Lord?

Leaning Inl

Moses taught Israel that God's commandments were to be at the center of family life. In your own words, what would Deuteronomy 6:6-9 "look like" today?

What are some possible results of obeying God's way in Deuteronomy 6:6-9? Do these commandments only apply to fathers teaching their children? Can we apply these commands in other ways?

Stapping Outl

As God prepared Israel to occupy the promised land, how could right living, or obeying His commandments, help fulfill His earlier promise to them that they would be a light to the nations (Genesis 18:18, Isaiah 49:6)?

How does obedience to these commands provide light to those around us? What parallels are there between Deuteronomy 6:6-12 and Matthew 28:19-20?
