





In Remembrance Of Me

As we prepare our hearts for communion today, please read and meditate on Romans 6:3-14 (below).
Communion remembers the union of identity with Christ.

As you read, please reflect on Christ's sacrifice. Are you united in identity with Him?

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin.

For one who has died has been set free from sin.

Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God.

So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions.

Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

Total identity with Christ. Nothing less. As we remember Christ together, is Jesus truly your everything?

this is my body which is for you. *do this in remembrance of me.*

this cup is the new covenant in my blood.

do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Breaking Bad

1) *Sabbatical Thanks*

- A) A “sabbatical” is an intentional time of rest, designed for reflection and renewal.
- B) Our church leadership sent Melinda and me out for sabbatical rest and renewal six months ago.
- C) As we return and transition back into ministry, we are deeply grateful for our sabbatical time.
- D) There are many highlights from sabbatical, which I am pleased to get to share with you in the years to come.

2) *Breaking Bad & Sabbatical Sin Confession*

- A) Like most of us, I want to follow Christ, but I find it difficult.
I worked hard at defeating sin (1 John 5:3-4).
I worked hard to obey as a disciple of Jesus (John 14:23-24).
- B) I worked hard to break away from all the bad stuff (sin) in my life.
I was also working hard at doing as much good stuff as I could fit into my life.
I was also burdened with accomplishing amazing things for God.
- C) Slowly (at first) family, ministry, and my best efforts lost balance.
I found I was getting angry easily. Everything became urgent.
I became a victim. I was frustrated with everyone.
- D) In my efforts to break up all the bad, workaholism and neglect became a justified habit in my life.
I sinned against my church family, my closest friends, my wife and children, and worst of all – God.

3) *Sabbatical Servanthood*

- A) Most of us are so busy doing things for everyone in our lives, we completely forget how to serve one another.
- B) Serving another means getting down on their level, or even getting down below another's level, in order to touch them with God's hands (John 13:1-20).
- C) It wasn't until I removed doing things from my life, and intentionally sought to spend time alone with God, that I began to see how I was busy doing much, but was missing a heart of serving Christ (Matthew 25:40).
- D) As odd as it might sound, doing less meant I could serve more.



4) *Sabbatical Blessing*

- A) In a similar manner, my life had become so busy, I was often speaking too many words, resulting in my words losing their actual meaning. The purpose and intention of my words lost their impact.
- B) The words we use are supposed to give life, they are meant to build up other people, the right word at just the right moment as though we speak God's words to each other (Ephesians 4:29).
- C) It wasn't until I removed human and electronic noise, and intentionally sought to listen to God, purposely imitating Christ in seeking loneliness from man in order to have better ears for God, that I could hear His blessing of me (Mark 1:35).
- D) I am most changed when I am most blessed. I am most able to bless others, when I am blessed by God. The words I speak carry life or death. God chose death which has given me life, and I choose blessing to freely give that blessing of abundant life to others.
