

Advent Love

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

~ 1 John 4:7-11

1) Christmas is a Time of Love

- A) Describing love is often complicated. Is it a feeling? A choice? Is there "love at first sight?" Can you love be lost? Why do some people "fall into love," while it eludes others who really want it? Does anybody really "find love?" Or, does "love find you?"
- B) One of the greatest and most understandable characteristics of God is His love. The Bible uses several words to describe God's love (OT ahav/chesed, NT phileo/agapao). God's love is often displayed, but is most vividly described in 1 Corinthians 13:1-13.
- C) Christmas is a time of love. There is something about Christmas that is warm, heartfelt, and inherently filled with love. This is no mistake, because Christmas began because of God's great love.
- D) One of the first parts of the Bible most followers of Christ learn and memorize is John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son..." On the very first Christmas, God gave the greatest gift of Jesus because He was motivated by love.
- E) The gifts we will give to one another next week for Christmas are a reflection of God's first great gift of Jesus. We give gifts in the same manner which God gives gifts, not because someone is deserving, but out of love (1 John 4:9).

2) Christmas is a Celebration of God's Love

- A) God's love is active. His love always intentionally gives. God's love always gives. If love does not naturally give to others, it is not the love of God (1 John 4:8). God's love is meant for the benefit of others, and is always self-sacrificing (Ephesians 5:1-2).
- B) The ultimate expression of God's love for mankind is Jesus Christ (1 John 4:8-9). Christmas is a celebration of this love, a love freely given, even to those who are undeserving of His love (4:10).
- C) God's love is abundant and is meant for all people without prejudice (Romans 10:9-13; John 3:16; see also Luke 2:10). God's love is capable of delivering on its promises and is powerful and sufficient enough to save everyone (1 Timothy 2:1-4).
- D) Simultaneously, God's love is selective and is only experienced by those who respond to Jesus (John 17:9-10; Ephesians 1:3-6). While God's love is limitless, it is only received by those who know they are sick, lost, broken, and/or sinful (Luke 19:10; 1 Timothy 1:15).
- E) God's love is compassionate and full of understanding (Psalm 103:8-14). God loves us as we are, but promises transformation from darkness to light, from sin to sainthood, and from unbelief and disbelief to being faithful and true (Acts 26:18, John 3:19-21).

3) Christmas is a Celebration of Messiah Jesus.

- A) The word "Christ" is a title, meaning "Messiah" (Anointed One from Isaiah 61:1-3). Jesus was the Anointed One, the Messiah, the promised Christ (Isaiah 9:2-7).
- B) Mary's virgin birth of Jesus (Matthew 1:18-25) is the fulfillment of the promised sign that God Himself would come as Messiah (Isaiah 7:14). The Messiah was to bring salvation (Isaiah 61:1-3), because of God's great love for mankind (1 John 4:9-10).
- C) Christmas celebrates Christ's birth, but also the purpose of His coming. Christ came to love sacrificially, and we are to do the same (1 John 3:16). This is the heart of Christmas love, to give what we have received; Jesus Christ, our Messiah (1 John 3:18).
