No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

1 Corinthians 10:13

1) A Case Study On Temptation

- A) There are clever similarities to most temptations in our lives. Almost all temptations masquerade a 'human want' as a 'human need.' In addition, almost all human temptations hide 'sin' behind a believable 'truthful veil.' Finally, most temptations can be reduced to a 'primary cause,' but actually involve numerous 'subtle causes' which get lost in the intoxicating responses of guilt and shame of our failure(s).
- B) For instance, consider the temptations of Adam & Eve (Genesis 3:1-13). The serpent tempts Eve by questioning the goodness of God's provision (3:5), veiling the sin of insubordination behind the half-truth of "you will not surely die" (3:4). But her sin? Yes, it is insubordination against God, but more subtly it is Eve's "eye" viewing sin as "good, delightful, and desirable," leading her to "see, take, and eat" (3:6).
- C) Adam, for his part in this story, has been strangely quiet (note his silence from 3:1 to most of 3:6), not challenging Eve's overstatement of "not touching" (3:3) or the serpent's deceptions (3:4-5), passively acquiescing to Eve's 'voice' to eat the fruit (3:6). Yes, Adam's sin was insubordination by eating fruit, but more subtly, Adam made his ears deaf to God's voice (note Adam's judgment in 3:17).
- D) Adam & Eve's responses? The stuff of legend. In a sad (but common to this day) isolating response, Adam & Eve hide from one another (3:7), hide from God (3:8-10), and try to hide the truth (3:10-11). Then, Adam subtly blames God and overtly blames Eve (3:12), and Eve responds by blaming the serpent (3:13). Intoxicating guilt and shame.

2) Superficial Reasons Result In Superficial Solutions

A) If you polled Christians about Adam & Eve's sin, what explanation would you hear? I imagine many would explain, "God told Adam & Eve to not

- eat an apple, but they did it anyway, which was sin, so God cast them out of Eden and now all of mankind deserves Hell, and it's all because they ate the fruit..." While partially true, it's also a wholly inadequate explanation, especially in our world!
- B) Is it any shock people think God is a temperamental wacko when these are the explanations of His people? It reminds me of a video I once watched, and good news, you are about to watch it right now (I hope).
- C) For many of us, the world we have grown up in was one of sin labels (sex, drugs, addictions, anger, abuse) and the solutions were often to simply "stop it." A more nuanced version of this has been, receive Jesus and then He will help you "stop it." While partially true, this is almost always a lie. This does not actually work, and is not taught in the Bible.

3) Why Do Temptations Tempt You?

- A) If you look at the three temptations of Christ (Luke 4:1-13), you could view three simple temptations (eat because you're hungry, bow down because you're merciful, and jump to prove God loves you). Of course, solving these temptations becomes easy as well. Just don't listen to the devil, listen to God, and everything will be fine. That's what Jesus did, right? Look at it, it's right there! That's what the verses mean, right?
- B) Look more closely. All of Jesus' answers are from the Exodus story (Deuteronomy 8:3, 6:13, and 6:16). Where Israel had been unfaithful in the desert, Jesus chooses obedience. This is not just about bread, it's about dependence. It's not about mercy for humanity, it's about God's glory. It's not about testing God, it's about trusting Him.
- C) Look even more closely. The devil is not just tempting Jesus, He is mocking God. He's not just tempting the Son, He is humiliating the Father. The devil knows God is unmoved by temptation, but clearly, he did not think that about Jesus. He works to drive a wedge of doubt into Jesus. He may lose this battle in the desert, but he is still trying to win the war, which will end up (not all that ironically) in a garden.
- D) Why were Jesus' temptations tempting? Because each of them tugged powerfully at both His deity & humanity. They were assaults against the whole person, the God-man suffering (Hebrews 2:18, 4:15-16).
- E) The temptations of Christ would not be tempting to you. But, why are your temptations tempting for you? Is it really about the sin labels? Like a disease symptom, we must go deeper to find why we are tempted. There are limitless temptations, but why do certain temptations "stick" to you?
- F) The devil is not omniscient, but he is hungry. You and I are like a juicy snack. Remember, escape may not be obvious, but Jesus is already there, and is delighted to provide us our escape in Him (1 Corinthians 10:13)!
