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


Like the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud on the day of rain, so was the appearance of the brightness all around. Such was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord. And when I saw it, I fell on my face, and I heard the voice of one speaking. And he said to me, "Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak with you."

Ezekiel 1:28–2:1

1) Skunked

- A) Jesus' popularity from Capernaum resulted in large crowds following Him around the Galilee region (Luke 5:1). Soon after departing Capernaum for the purpose of spreading the Gospel of the Kingdom of God (4:43), Jesus comes upon a couple of empty fishing boats belonging to Simon. Jesus requests to teach from Simon's boat, requiring Simon to assist Jesus by holding the boat steady, while Jesus sat and taught the crowd (5:2-3).
- B) The Sea of Galilee is identified by various names in the Bible, usually to emphasize a region (e.g. Kinnereth or Chinnereth, Numbers 34:11, Joshua 11:2; or Lake of Gennesaret, Luke 5:1), or a large and popular city-place (e.g. Sea of Tiberias, John 6:1). As Jesus departs Capernaum, he heads South, to an area near the small fishing location of Gennesaret.
- C) There were two primary methods of fishing in the Sea of Galilee. The first involved an easy to throw circular net, used in the shallow shoreline



areas, where an individual fisherman could throw his net like a cowboy's lasso to catch encircle and net smaller fish (Matthew 4:18).

- D) The second method of fishing involved spreading a huge net, often between two boats (100-200 feet wide), with weights on one side of the net (for depth) and floats on the other side of the net (for buoyancy). The net was dragged behind the boat(s), catching fish in deep water. The nets were then drawn in by hand, and were very heavy (even without fish)! This required powerful and rugged men with great physical endurance (5:2-5).
- E) As is still true today, fish migrate and feed at night, so fisherman dragged deeper waters in evening hours (Luke 5:5). In ancient Galilee, linen nets were used (multi-layered trammel netting), and would reflect light in the daytime. Thus, daytime fishing was for novices, or worse yet, fools...
- F) Every morning, after a long night of work, fisherman had to wash their nets (Luke 5:2, mud and gravel caused damage), do needed repairs (Matthew 4:21, nets commonly snagged, tore, and needed tightening), and dry the nets for the next evening of fishing (Ezekiel 26:14, 47:10; drying & folding cleaned nets prevented decay/rotting).
- G) Simon graciously allows Jesus to use his boat as a small floating pulpit for teaching (Luke 5:3); Simon might have felt he "owed" Jesus this much for healing his mother-in-law (cf. 4:38-39). But when Jesus tells Simon to go out and drop his (cleaned, mended, and now drying) nets to catch some fish, you can hear the angst in Simon's reply, 'we are fishermen, and we got skunked! But hey, if you ("master teacher") say so…' (5:5).

2) Jesus the Fish Whisperer

- A) So out they went, and following the exact same method he knew so well, Simon began drawing in his nets (5:6). To his shock and elation, the nets were filled with unexpected fish! So many fish! Too many fish! The nets!
- B) In his powerful and straining hands, Simon could feel the pop and snap of the nets, but not wanting to alert the entire fishing industry of the western shoreline, he frantically signals for his other boat to come and help. There are so many fish, both boats begin to dangerously take on water (5:7)!

3) Ruined & Redefined by Jesus

- A) In that very moment, Simon Peter (note his more familiar name "Petros," meaning "Rock," is introduced) collapses into the bottom of the boat, falling on his knees with the fish, ruined in his sin (cf. Isaiah 6:1-5). Simon has seen Jesus' authority and power in the synagogue (4:31-37), in Simon's household (4:38-41), and now over nature and even Simon's own vocation (5:8-10)! Simon is left with nothing, and fearfully begs Jesus to relent.
- B) This is true repentance, an agonized response of being ruined by Jesus. This is grace, that Jesus does not leave Simon in his sin, but replaces his old life of catching fish with a redefined life of "catching men alive," just as Peter himself has been captured and redefined by Jesus (5:10-11)!
